


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
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

PICES is producing the third in a series of North Pacific Ecosystem Status Reports (NPESR) to assess the status and trends in North Pacific marine ecosystems, and the vulnerability and resilience of ecosystems to changes in the climate and human activities.






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Due to the immense size of the Pacific Ocean and variability in the ecosystems one of the first steps in the NPESR process was to identify regions that could be assessed individually. These individual regional assessments can then be synthesized into an Ecosystem Status Report for the entire North Pacific.




Because there was no existing regional classification system that met PICES needs a modified biogeographical classification system of 15 regions around the North Pacific has been adopted.

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For each of the 15 regional assessments information is required to describe the status of the ecosystem, and any trends over the period between 2009 and 2016.

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An integral part of the process is the NPESR-3 Data Management System

- 1. To facilitate the <u>submission</u>, the <u>organization</u>, and the <u>availability</u> of scientific information for the production of NPESR-3.
- To reduce the effort that was experienced by authors of NPESRs 1 and 2 to access the information needed to write the report.



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Structure of the Data Management System.

- 1. Web-based software Submittables.com with head offices in Montana, USA.
- 2. Use Amazon AWS servers; data capacity is unlimited and data are stored redundantly in multiple physical locations across the United States.
- 3. The website interface is customized to meet our requirements (PICES).
- 4. We term our submissions **Environmental Time Series Observations** (ETSOs).
- 5. Recently increased data security to HIPAA compliance certification.
- 6. All submissions are required to include metadata.

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Processing information using the Data Management System

- PICES members recognize a suitable ETSO for NPESR-3, and a contributor willing to submit it.
- 2. The contributor, or a PICES ETSO coordinator, uses the internet to access the *Submittable* website (all that is needed is a free, personal *Submittable* account).
- 3. Following the instructions provided by the web-based software the ETSO is submitted. Work can be saved as a draft at any time in the process.
- 4. Jeanette Gann holds the highest administrative privileges and assigns the submission to a reviewer (typically the lead author of the NPESR-3 region most relevant to the ETSO).



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Processing information using the Data Management System


- 5. There may be an exchange between the submitter and the reviewer to discuss the meaning or application of the ETSO to NPESR-3, and to confirm the attribution of the data.
- 6. The reviewer can view, comment and rate submissions assigned to them. A recommendation is then made to accept and complete the submission so that it becomes part of the NPESR-3 database.



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Given the cloud-based structure of the system ETSOs can be submitted asynchronously and there is no limit on how many are submitted.






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Web access provides an overview of submissions and status of ETSOs.






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Search filters are used to identify sub-datasets of the ETSO archive.






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Reports can be generated by exporting filtered data to .csv file.

Export Data



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Level 5 (Highest/Administrator) can fully manage team members, submissions, response templates, submission forms and the organization profile.

Level 4 can do everything Level 5 can do except manage the profile and view income reports.

Level 3 can fully administer submissions assigned to them (view all ratings/reviews, accept, decline, interact with submitter). Cannot view reports or private notes of other users. Cannot access settings pages (team, response templates, etc.).

Level 2 can only view, comment, rate and reassign submissions assigned to them. Cannot accept or decline.

Level 1 can only view, comment and rate submissions assigned to them. Cannot accept, decline or reassign submissions or interact with submitter.



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Summary of benefits:

- 1. A simple system not expected to change much over the next five years.
- After the assignment and review of ETSOs there are minimal custodial requirements.
- 3. The submission forms can be customized to accommodate changing PICES priorities.
- 4. Access to the data is controlled by PICES using permission levels.
- 5. Submittables provides system security upgrades as required.
- 6. An unlimited number of ETSOs can be submitted and stored in the database.
