



- "Adaptation and maladaptation to environmental change - Factors that influence the fragility or resilience of sub-Arctic fisheries and fishing dependent communities" <u>Keith Criddle</u>
- "Durable individual entitlements to shares of the allowable catch increase profitability that helps fishermen adapt to modest adverse changes in stock abundance, exvessel prices, and input costs but their fragility to larger perturbations is increased."
- "In addition, while catch shares increase choice and therefore resilience from the perspective of individuals, catch shares can increase or decrease the resilience of fishery dependent communities"


